Also the Homage also for a day further and it is granted for each tenant and inhabitant as well of the manor of Dorney as of the manor of Boveney, on a certain day before Christmas next fixed and appointed by the major part of the tenants and inhabitants of the same manors to make a view, amend and restore to their places all encroachments and faults in and on the metes and bounds of meadows and other lands of the aforesaid manors still not amended, and each tenant and inhabitant making default at the day appointed as is aforesaid shall forfeit to the lord of the manor 12d. And that at the next court the Homage shall present defaulters, if any there be, and what they have done in the matter.

Also the Homage present by William Mountague and Thomas Mountague detailed for this point alone that Robert Mountague has died since the last court seized of certain lands in Dorney, but the certainty of these lands or in what estate he was seized or what falls due there to the lord the Jurors still do not know. Therefore they ask a day until the next court to find and present the certainty of these matters And they say that the said Robert had issue Mary Mountague his daughter, of the age of one year or thereabouts.

The Homage say & present on their oath that John Norreis, who held divers lands of the lord of this manor, has ended his days since the last court, and that Richard Norreis is his son and next heir and is of the age of eight years. And because the Homage do not know the certainty of the lands held by the aforesaid John or the services by which they were held, therefore they ask for a day until the next court to enquire concerning the same, and then a day is given to the aforesaid Richard to do fealty and relief.

Also it is further presented that John Norreis has set up a certain fence and encroached on the lord's ground next to Tapers in Boveney, and a day is given to amend it and rectify the said fence before Christmas next, by the advice and judgment of William Montague, Robert Montague and Thomas Lovegey, tenants there.
