} Court baron of Dame Elizabeth Garrat, widow, late
wife (&c.as above) held there the ninth of October
and then postponed to the second of December in
the year of our Lord James, by the grace of God
King of England, France & Ireland, Defender of the
Faith the fifteenth, and of Scotland the fiftieth.(1616)

Free tenants.

First the Homage present on their oaths the names
of those who have made default, therefore they are
in mercy as appears over the head of each of them:

William Clarke, knight	12d.
The Provost & Fellows of Eton	12d.
The Dean & Canons of Windsor	12d.
Henry Bell, gent.	4d.
Churchwardens of Burnham	4d.

Fealty.

Also the Homage present on their oaths that John
Garrat, gent., made alienation of his free tenements,
viz. two tenements and divers lands, &c. held of this
manor, to one Henry Fellow for rent of 6s.3d. and
other services, and he gives the lady for relief
6s.3d. and has done his fealty to her.

Also Henry Carter, Bailiff of this manor, presents
on his oath as follows, that Francis Norris had an
animal called a swine impounded in the lady's pound
of this manor, and also four others called hogs
impounded there, and a horse; and also that Thomas
Dollin had a sheep impounded in the said pound; and
also that Richard Foster had divers sheep impounded
in the said pound, and also that Nicholas How had a
horse impounded in the said pound; and also that John
How son of Nicholas How made various attacks on the
hayward of this manor taking various cattle to impound

in the pound of this manor; on which the said Thomas Dollin and Richard Sedden, two Jurors of this manor and sworn as affeerers, on the oath of the said Henry Carter, present that the aforesaid cattle were impounded in the pound of this manor, and that John How made rescue and that the said cattle were removed from the said pound without leave of the lady of this manor, or the bailiff. Therefore they are in mercy as appears on the head of each: First of Francis Norris 20s. of Richard Foster 10s.; of Nicholas How, 10s.; of John How, 10s.; of Thomas Dollin, 2d.

Also the said Henry Carter presents further on his oath that Thomas Dollin (in English) did break orders for the common of the lady of this manor made by consent, &c. in putting in of one sheep into the common contrary to the orders, &c. and further the said Henry Carter presents on his oath (Richard) Foster for the like offence for five sheep put into the (common) contrary to the orders; therefore they are in mercy as appears on the head of each, item of Thomas Dollin, 3s.4d., of Richard Foster, 16s.8d.

Also the aforesaid present that the pound-breach and rescue were affeered by the Steward and by the aforesaid Thomas Dollin and Richard Sedden at the aforesaid court baron upon their oaths from 40s. unto the aforesaid ameracements.

Also finally it is decreed that the earlier Ordinances made before this shall remain in force as before.
