Ciceter:

William Mountegue acknowledges that he holds of the
lord of this manor a messuage with appurtenances
called Cramp Hide, by fealty of court and annual
rent of 6d. payable at feasts of the Annunciation of
the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Michael the Archangel
by equal portions, and by relief after alienation
and death, whenever that may occur.

James Foord acknowledges that he holds of the lord
of this manor a messuage called Lawyers with
appurtenances and an acre of land adjoining thereto,

and an acre of land, viz. a headland in Foxhurst, and half an acre in Somaton by the above services and annual rent of 4d.

William Oliver acknowledges that he holds as above a messuage in which he now dwells with appurtenances, by the above services and annual rent of 2s.2d.

William Wetherheade holds as above a messuage and three acres of land, viz. a half acre in New Croft, a half acre in Okestubb, a half acre in Upcottes, a half acre in Thames Field, a half acre of meadow in West Meade, another half acre of meadow in Rowmoore, by the above services and annual rent of 12d.

Robert Cox acknowledges that he holds as above a tenement or messuage at Lent with a close of pasture adjoining thereto by the service aforesaid and annual rent of 4d.

Also that William Oliver, father of the aforesaid William Oliver, had died since the last court, wherefore there falls to the lord for relief, 2s.2d., and fealty.

Boveney.

William Mountegue, gent., holds of the lord of this manor twenty acres of estimation of land and meadow with appurtenances lying dispersed in the common fields of Boveney and Dorney late Groves by fealty, suit of court and annual rent of 4d. payable at the feasts of the Annunciation and Michael the Archangel by equal portions, and by relief on alienation or death when it occurs.

James Foord holds as above a close called Porters Buttes, and two acres in North Field lying within

and two acres of land in Tibstone lying together late Groves by services aforesaid and annual rent of 2d.

Thomas Dollen holds as above a half acre of land with appurtenances called Hawkeland, by services aforesaid and annual rent of 4d.

Francis Norries holds as above a messuage with appurtenances called Durdantes late of Robert Mountegue, junior, deceased, and eleven acres of land and meadow by estimation pertaining to the said messuage lying in Boveney and Dorney, by services aforesaid and annual rent of 17d. payable as above.

James Foord holds as above a pightle* and a buttice of land and pasture adjoining his dwellinghouse, late of Robert Mountegue, junior, by service as aforesaid and annual rent of 2d.

William Oliver holds as above a pightle of pasture and twelve acres of land and pasture late of Robert Mountegue, junior, by services as aforesaid and annual rent of 19d. as it is said, but query whether he paid 2s.2d. yearly for messuage in Cioiter, which very messuage is part of the lands and tenements late of Robert Montegue, for which it is said that an annual rent of as much as 3s.2d. used to be paid.

William Bell, esq., holds as above a close of land with appurtenances called Calves Leaze alias Wick Close by services as aforesaid and annual rent of 20d. And the Homage present that Henry Bell, father of the aforesaid William, has died since the last court, wherefore there falls due to the lord for relief 20d.

* pightle (pidella), a small field enclosed by a hedge, often an odd corner between other fields.

Henry Fellow holds as above (three acres of meadow crossed out) a messuage and garden with appurtenances lately bought of John Garrard and earlier of James Norries by services as aforesaid. 6s.3d. (may have been inserted later)

Francis Clerk, kt., holds as above a close of land with appurtenances called Westharris lying in parish of Burnham by services as aforesaid and annual rent of Four shillings and four pence, and the Homage say that William Clerke, kt., father of the said Francis, who held the premises, has died since the last court, wherefore there falls due to the lord for heriot ii() fealty.

Also they present that John Kedermister, kt., (has encroached) on the lord's waste at Lake End seven acres of pasture, to the serious injury of the tenants of the lord of this manor, (who ought) to have common of pasture there. Therefore it is decreed that the said John and his assigns (shall remove) the encroachment and allow the tenants () there before the feast of Pentecost next following, on pain of forfeiting £20 (to the lord) of the manor.

() Robert M() has encroached () of pasture of estimation at Lakend of the lord's waste () the aforesaid Robert and his assigns shall amend () their common there before the feast of Pentecost () to the lord.

The Dean and Canons of Windsor hold of the lord of this manor a messuage and fifty acres of land, meadow

and pasture in Dorney and Boveney by the services aforesaid, and by annual rent of £13.

Thomas Dollen holds as above a messuage and twenty acres of land, meadow and pasture by estimation with appurtenances in Dorney and Boveney by services as aforesaid and by annual rent of 5s. And it is to be known that the messuage and eight acres by estimation of the premises lie in North Field, one "Virga" (? red) in Southfield, one acre in Okestub, two acres in Upcottes, three half acres and a "virga" in Foxhurst, three half acres at the Wharfe, half an acre of meadow in Shorteveere, half an acre of meadow at Mousham End, a virga in the thirteen virges, a virge at Alders Corner, a virge abutting on Dorney Green, a virge in Gatemers, an acre and three rods in the Lake abutting on South Field, an acre in the Lake abutting on the New Close.

William Mountegue aforesaid acknowledges that he holds as above part of Dollens, an acre of land and half of meadow in Rotchett, and a half acre of land in Bitton by services as aforesaid and annual rent, 4d.

(apparently inserted later:) also for Kites acre, 6d.

William Oliver holds a half acre, part of Dollens in Foxhurst by services as aforesaid and annual rent of 2d.

Richard Sedwyn holds as above a messuage with appurtenances and five acres by estimation lying in the common fields, viz. two acres of meadow in Rosthill, one half acre of meadow in Smithwell mede, three acres of land in Foxhurst, a half acre in Upcottes, a half acre in Okestubbs, a half acre in North Field, by services as aforesaid and by annual

rent of 6d.

. Rouland Hinde, esq., holds as above an acre of land in Thames Veere, late of William Abrooke by services as aforesaid and annual rent of a penny.

Memorandum that before this, viz. about twenty years ago the lord of this manor bought a half acre of land in the New Close of Thomas Dollen father of the aforesaid Thomas Dollen, part of his lands above-named, wherefore he asks apportionment at 2d. Therefore the lord is to be consulted.

John Foord holds as above a close of land late Aylewards next to Michell Heath by services as aforesaid and rent of a penny.

Francis Clerke, kt., holds as above a close called Ashencoppice, part of Ickenhams by services as aforesaid and by annual rent, 2s.
