Presentments of the Court Baron (English) } Imprimis the Jury aforesaid upon their oaths present all those that owe suit and service unto the courts and have not appeared.

Item we present that William Bennet died since the last Court seized of a messuage and several lands and that a relief is thereupon due unto the Lord.

Item we present that William Oliver died since the last Court and that there is a relief due unto the Lord.

Item we present John Grover died since the last Court and that a relief is due unto the Lord.

Order of the Court Leet and Court Baron } Imprimis it is ordered that the inhabitants of Boveney aforesaid scour and cleanse the ditch leading from Ladies Lease corner to Scotchshawe Gate by the first day of May next under pen lty of one shilling for every pole by every owner upon notice.

Item it is ordered that the land-holders of

Boveney aforesaid cleanse and scout the ditch leading from Lotts-hole to Gilten Gate by the first day of May next under the penalty of forfeiting one shilling for every pole not done.

Item it is ordered that the hedges and ditches belonging to the inhabitants and land-holders of Boveney aforesaid from Sheapards Close to Taylors corner be repaired and cleansed by the first day of May next under the penalty of forfeiting one shilling for every pole not repaired and scoured by those that ought to do it.

Item it is ordered that the inhabitants and owners of hogs in Boveney aforesaid do ring their hogs by the tenth day of April next under the penalty of forfeiting four pence for every hog unringed by the owner thereof.

Item it is ordered that the inhabitants and land-holders of Boveney aforesaid do repair and amend the hedges about Old-field and <sup>asR</sup> ~~Alis~~field by the tenth day of April next ensuing under the penalty of forfeiting one shilling for every pole not done.

Item it is ordered that the inhabitants of Boveney take out their sheep out of the Common meadows under the penalty of forfeiting one shilling for every sheep there after the tenth day of March.

Item it is ordered that the inhabitants of Boveney aforesaid do scour and cleanse the ditch from Lowthers Pool to the River of Thames by the twentieth of May next ensuing under the penalty of one shilling for every pole not done.

Item it is ordered that the land-holders do make and keep up the fences from Nash his house to Ashfield gate under the penalty of forfeiting for every pole not done by those that ought to do it the

sum of one shilling by the tenth day of April next ensuing.

Item it is ordered that the sum of five pounds be raised by a pound-rate to be made by the Churchwardens and Overseers for the time being upon the inhabitants of Boveney to be applied by them the said Churchwardens and Overseers towards the repair of the Thames bank and they to account for the same to the inhabitants and if there be any overplus to restore the same to the succeeding Churchwardens and Overseers.

Item it is ordered that the stint touching the Common made at Dorney Court shall stand and bind the inhabitants of Boveney being made by a general consent of both manors and hereunder written
