} Court baron of William Garrard, Alderman of London, held there on Friday 19th October in the second year of the reign of the most illustrious and mighty Prince our most serene lord Edward VI, by the grace of God King of England, France & Ireland, Defender of the Faith and supreme Head on earth of the English and Irish Church. (1548)

Fines 8d. The said Homage present on their oath that Ambrose  
2d. Aldryge, Robert Covyngton and Thomas Mountegewe are tenants of this manor and owe suit of court, and have made default at this court. Therefore each of them is in mercy. 4d.

Penalty. Also the said Homage further present on their oath that Thomas Dollyng has enclosed a certain parcel of land with divers fences in the common field called le Northefeyld containing by estimation three acres of land, contrary to the custom of this manor; and that the same Thomas blocks a certain cart-way leading by the common fences next to the

town of Dorney, to the grave injury of his neighbours. Therefore he has a day to remove the said fences round the said close, and to allow the said way to be open, and that he shall no more make fences on the said way under pain of 6s.8d.

 Therefore each of them forfeits the penalty agreed  
 in the same courts, viz. each of them 3s.4d.

 John Goldyng, John Allen, James Yerol and Thomas  
 Fylbye are overcharging the common there called  
 Dorney Grene with their geese and ganders, each of  
 them in excess of his stint, contrary to the  
 ordinances and customs made in the aforesaid court.  
 Therefore each of them is in mercy as appears over  
 the head of each.

- Day given. A day is given to all the tenants that they ring and make lawful their pigs, each of them before the feast of All Saints next following on pain of 2d. forfeited for each pig as often as it be found to the contrary.
- Day given. A day is given to all tenants having land in the common fields called Oldfelde and Asshefeld that each of them shall well and adequately make and set up fences and clean his ditches round the said fields each for his own land, before the feast of All Saints next following, on pain of forfeiting for each perch 4d.
- Day given. A day is given to William Webbe and Thomas Heytone that they clean their ditches and set up their fences for their own land lying in the East corner of the common field called Olde Felde before the feast of All Saints next following, on pain of forfeiting for each perch 12d.
- Penalty. Also the said Homage have a penalty that each of them shall bring his sheep to the officers of the lord of this manor at the time of sheep-shearing, to <sup>mark</sup> make those sheep with a certain mark wherewith they are accustomed to mark sheep there, viz. with a letter D, on pain of 3s.4d. for as often as they do not do it.
- Penalty. Also a day is given to Richard Colnerhows, Richard Mighell, Edward Taylor, John Bullock, Richard Bylgryfe, John Allen, Robert Poultone, John Johnson,

James Yerome and Robert Yngby to make a certain cart gate in a certain lane called Fitzwaterlane between lands called Swans and Fitzwaters before the feast of the Annunciation of Blessed Mary next, on pain of each of them forfeiting 8d.

Penalty.

Also the said Homage have chosen Richard Colnerhows in place of John Goldyng, with Thomas Grove, William Mountegewe and Mark Synpson to oversee the execution of the Statutes and Ordinances touching the commons there, under pain of each one failing to forfeit 3s.4d. if he does not do his said duty by an essoin (= deputy)

Encroachment.

Also the said Homage present that Nicholas Forde of Boveney has cut down a certain stock called a stake which was the mete and bound between the land of Thomas Grove and the land of the same Nicholas in a certain meadow called South mede lake, and has encroached on the land of the same Thomas. And he has a day to replace the stake there as a boundary mark between the same lands, on pain of 20d.
