Manor of Dorney } Court baron of William Garrard, Alderman of London, held there on Thursday, viz. 4th day of December in the third year of the reign of the most illustrious and mighty prince our most serene lord Edward VI, by the grace of God King of England, France and Ireland, Defender of the Faith and supreme Head on earth of the English and Irish Church. Also the said Homage present on their oath that Robert Ingby, who held freely of the lord a messuage with curtilage called Kynboldys and $4\frac{1}{2}$ acres $1\frac{1}{2}$ rods of land and two acres of meadow with appurtenances by rent of 6s.6d. yearly, heriot, relief, fealty and suit of court, has ended his days since the last court, after whose death there falls due to the lord as heriot a cow price 13s.4d. of which cow

the lord is already possessed and seized; and that William Ingby is brother and next heir of the same Robert Ingby and is of full age; and that there falls due to the lord as relief for the messuage and other premises 6s.6d., for which the lord's bailiff is required to distrain, and to answer for it to the lord at the next court.

Also the said Homage present on their oath that Thomas Dollyn ^{40s.} has behaved badly to the Steward of the court sitting in court, has abused him and spoken evil and slanderous words madly in court, viz. that the said Steward has written and entered in the rolls of the court such presentments as the Homage have never presented, and has put forth other contumelious words against the same Steward. Therefore he is in mercy as appears.

Penalty.

Also the said Homage present that the ditch called South mede dyche is unscoured and the course of the water there is stopped up, by default of divers of the lord's tenants. Therefore each of the tenants having meadow and land there shall well and sufficiently scour the said ditch seven feet in breadth, each of them as concerns his own land before the feast of St. Thomas the Apostle next following (21st Dec.) under pain of forfeiting 4d. for each perch.

Penalty.

Also the said Homage present that the fences from the house of Alice Kynge as far as Golden Hedge are through default of repairs.

Therefore a day is given to all tenants having any lands there that each of them shall well and sufficiently repair and set up the said fences before the feast of Epiphany next, on pain of forfeiting 4d. for each perch.

Penalty.

Also the said Homage present on their oath that the fences in Northfeld from the house of Richard Colverhous as far as Cynnam Parke hedge, and that the fences from the house of William Goldwyn as far as the house of Mark Simpson are very ruinous. Therefore each tenant having lands and tenements there shall well and sufficiently set up the fences along his own land before the feast of the Annunciation of Blessed Mary next following, on pain of forfeiting 4d. for each perch.

as they had penalty given against them at the last court. Therefore they have forfeited that penalty, viz. each of them 8d. as appears above.

Also the said homage present that Nicholas Forde of Boveney has not replaced a certain stake which was the mote and bound between the land of Thomas Grove and the land of the same Nicholas in South lake mede, and that he has not restored a certain encroachment there, as he had a day given at the last court. So he has that penalty viz. 20d. and further has penalty to restore and replace the stake in its right place and to remove the encroachment aforesaid before Christmas next coming on pain of 3s.4d.

Agreement.

It is thus agreed at this court by the whole Homage that all the tenants of this manor shall assemble at the Church of Dorney on the Monday immediately after Christmas next, coming about the eighth hour in the morning of the same day, and that from there they shall go to all the common fields within the manor where need shall lie to set up metes and bounds between the lands of the tenants there, and each tenant failing and refusing to observe the said ordinance shall forfeit 12d.

It is settled and fully agreed between the aforesaid William Garrard, lord of this manor, and all and singular his tenants, that the same William Garrard, now lord of the manor, and his

heirs shall have, possess and hold to him his heirs and assigns a close of pasture called Seven acres separately and enclosed for ever, without any interference or casting down of fences there by the said tenants their heirs or assigns The said William Garrard and his heirs shall be bound to pay 12d. yearly for ever towards the repair of the Kings highways within the manor aforesaid.
