- **Impact of the M4 Motorway:** The *Parish News* begins to address the construction of the M4 motorway, a major infrastructure project that would significantly alter Dorney's landscape and connection to the wider region.
- **Gratitude for the Blue Bus Service:** The *Parish News* expresses appreciation for the Blue Bus service, highlighting its importance in connecting residents to neighbouring towns and services. The potential discontinuation of the service raises concerns about the impact on the community.
