

Dorney in 1975: A Year of Community Life and Local Developments

Key Themes Emerging in Dorney During 1975

 - The **Dorney Women's Social Club (DWSC)** offers a space for women to connect, learn, and engage in social activities. They arrange outings to the Theatre Royal Windsor and host demonstrations, showcasing a commitment to fostering a sense of community among women in the village.
 - The **active participation of the Dorney Guides, Brownies, and Cub Scouts** contributes to the energy and dynamism of the village. They engage in badge-earning activities, organise events like coffee mornings and jumble sales, and embody a spirit of community service.
- **The Parish Council as a Force for Local Action:** The Parish Council actively addresses matters of local concern, reflecting a commitment to serving the community's needs. Key issues discussed include:
 - Securing a signpost for the Vicarage at Dent's Corner.
 - Seeking replacements for missing reflecting road studs ("cat's eyes").
 - Addressing concerns about the bus service.
 - Managing the children's playground and prohibiting unauthorised parking.
 - Expressing gratitude to Mr. M.I. Davies for repeatedly repairing the Jubilee Seat after vandalism.
 - Organising bulk refuse container placements.
 - Investigating the feasibility of a gas supply to Dorney Reach.
 - Debating the S.E.B. lighting charges increase.
 - Participating in the Best Kept Village Competition.
 - Raising concerns about a proposed water extraction development, citing potential negative impacts on the village.
- **Economic Challenges and Community Resilience:** The *Parish News* acknowledges the economic difficulties facing the nation, reflecting a broader context of uncertainty and hardship. The community responds with resilience, demonstrating a spirit of collaboration and resourcefulness through:

- **Fundraising initiatives:** The DWI and DDHS organise events to bolster their funds and support community projects.
- **Resource sharing and cost-saving measures:** The DDHS considers offering surplus seeds to members at reduced prices to help mitigate the impact of rising fertiliser costs.
- **Focus on community self-sufficiency:** The *Parish News* promotes initiatives like "Dig for Victory" gardening, encouraging residents to maximise their garden productivity and contribute to food security.
