

A Look at Dorney Parish in 1982

The *Dorney Parish News* from 1982 offers a captivating glimpse into the daily life, concerns, and celebrations of a close-knit English village, revealing a community deeply invested in preserving its unique character and navigating evolving circumstances.

Community Life and Organisations

- **Dorney Women's Social Club:** This active group enjoyed a diverse range of activities, including a talk on the vagaries of British weather by a forecaster from the Bracknell Weather Centre. Their calendar also included theatre trips and visits to department stores, showcasing their interest in culture and social outings.
- **Dorney Women's Institute (DWI):** The DWI held regular meetings featuring various educational and engaging activities. One session involved a demonstration of lacemaking, a traditional craft, while another focused on learning about the international work of the Associated Country Women of the World. These gatherings suggest a blend of preserving heritage skills and embracing global perspectives.
- **Dorney Cub Scouts:** The Cub Scouts engaged in activities like the District Founders Activity Day and a swimming gala, indicating an active youth organisation fostering teamwork and skill development.
- **Dorney Girl Guides:** The Guides celebrated their 10th anniversary with a series of events, including a jumble sale and a special birthday party. Their accomplishments included winning the District Swimming Gala, demonstrating their commitment to physical activity and healthy competition.

Local Governance and Parish Council Activities

- **Parish Council Meetings:** The Parish Council diligently addressed various matters crucial to the well-being of the village. Minutes from the Annual Parish Meeting and subsequent meetings reveal discussions on:
 - **Parish Precept:** The Council presented and discussed the budget for the upcoming fiscal year, ensuring transparency and accountability to residents.
 - **Children's Playground:** Recognising the importance of recreational spaces for families, the Council addressed the maintenance and potential upgrades to the children's playground.
 - **Opening of Dorney Court:** The Council discussed the schedule and logistics for the public opening of Dorney Court, a significant historical landmark in the village.
 - **Parish Magazine:** The continuation of the *Parish Magazine* was a subject of discussion, highlighting its role as a vital communication tool for the community.
 - **Eton Dorney Project:** The Council engaged in discussions about the Eton Dorney Project, an initiative involving collaboration with Eton College. While the specifics of the project are not fully elaborated upon, it suggests a close relationship between the village and the esteemed educational institution.
 - **Cinagro:** Concerns about the potential environmental impact of Cinagro, a fertiliser, were raised, reflecting the community's awareness of ecological issues.

- **Sewage Works Proposal:** The potential development of a sewage works near the village sparked significant concern and opposition from residents, highlighting their determination to protect their environment and quality of life.
- **Financial Matters:** The Parish Council demonstrated responsible financial stewardship, publishing detailed accounts of expenditures and income in the *Parish News*.

Community Concerns and Developments

- **Public Transport:** The availability and reliability of bus services emerged as a point of concern, with residents expressing a desire for improved transportation options. The Parish Council actively engaged in discussions with transportation authorities to address these needs.
- **Impact Lorries:** Parking by large "Impact" lorries became a nuisance, obstructing pavements and raising safety concerns. The Parish Council sought solutions to mitigate this problem.
- **Dogs Fouling Footways:** The issue of dog fouling on public walkways prompted the implementation of a new bylaw, reflecting the Council's commitment to maintaining a clean and pleasant environment.

Historical Reflections and Community Pride

- **Nature Competition:** A nature competition held in memory of Mr. & Mrs. Evins highlights the community's appreciation for the natural beauty of their surroundings and their commitment to honouring valued members of the village.
- **Reflections on the Towpath:** The towpath at Dorney Reach sparked a series of letters to the *Parish News*, demonstrating residents' passion for preserving public access to the riverside and maintaining its beauty.

The *Dorney Parish News* from 1982 portrays a village grappling with change while holding onto its cherished traditions and values. The spectre of development loomed, threatening to disrupt Dorney's peaceful environment, yet residents demonstrated resilience and determination to protect their way of life.
