

## **Dorney Parish in 2004: A Year of Community Engagement, Local Concerns, and Olympic Aspirations**

  - A "Son et Lumiere" event and the society's Annual General Meeting (AGM)

- **Dorney Village Hall:** The village hall was a hub of community activity, hosting a wide range of events, such as:
  - Parish Council meetings
  - The Annual Parish Meeting
  - DDHS events
  - Dorney Over 60's Club luncheons
  - Dorney Badminton Club sessions
  - Social dances
  - Meetings of other local organisations, including Brownies, Rainbows, and youth groups
- **St. James' Church:** The church played a central role in parish life, with regular services, a thriving Sunday School, and outreach initiatives.

- **Fundraising Efforts:** Various community groups, including the church and the DDHS, organised fundraising events to support local causes and initiatives.

### Local Concerns and Challenges
