 - For barley fields: before Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary
- Penalties of 40d for non-compliance
- Restrictions on sheep grazing:
 - Not in meadows before Michaelmas (40d fine)
 - Not on Dorney grene before Christmas (12d fine)
- James Richardes and John Putney ordered to reopen a plough track in Northefeld by 1st August (6s.8d penalty)

7. Affeerers (assessors of fines): John Shepperd and John Grey sworn in.
