He died seized in demesne as of fee of and in manors of Dorney and Boveney in co. Bucks with their members and appurtenances, by grant to John Adee and James Rogers in Parliament to me of said Richard and Lettice his wife, who survives him and remains seized in and of said manors.

Manor of Dorney is worth, yearly in all issues besides reprises £35 = 16d., and is held of lord Edward, Prince of Wales and Duke of Cornwall as of his Honour of Wallingford by fealty and rent of 2s. yearly for all services.

Manor of Boveney held of Crown as of manor of Burnham in said co., part of possessions of late Abbey or Monastery of Burnham, by fealty and rent of 10s. yearly for all services.

Richard Hyll held also manors of Rokesby and Westbourne in parish of Burnham, with property in Beaconsfield and Datchet (described). He died 7<sup>th</sup> June last, and James Hylle, esq., is his son and next heir, aged 28 and more.
